

HAZMAT FIXED FACILITIES



If greater than 1 in any area **DO NOT ENTER**, it's just too dangerous!

Avoid use of water!

HEALTH

- 0 Like Ordinary Material
- 1 Slightly Hazardous
- 2 Hazardous - Use Breathing Apparatus
- 3 Extremely Dangerous - Use Protective Clothing
- 4 Too Dangerous To Enter - Vapor or Liquid

FLAMMABLE

- 0 Will Not Burn
- 1 Must Be Preheated To Burn
- 2 Ignites When Moderately Heated
- 3 Ignited At Normal Temperatures
- 4 Extremely Flammable

REACTIVE

- 0 Normally Stable
- 1 Unstable If Heated - Use Normal Precautions
- 2 Violent Chemical Change Possible
- 3 Strong Shock or Heat May Detonate
- 4 May Detonate - Vacate Area If Exposed To Fire



YOUR HOME AND YOUR FAMILY COME FIRST!

Make sure your home and family are safe and taken care of by shutting off all utilities if necessary. Assess your home for structural damage, and then call your predetermined out-of-state contact. Listen to your radio for special instructions before leaving your home.

ASSIST YOUR NEIGHBORS

WORK ONLY WITH A BUDDY... CERT IS A TEAM!

SIZE-UP ALL SITUATIONS

Before entering any building do a 360° walk-around. Is it too dangerous? If yes walk or run away. Document and then report the situation to the appropriate agency.


LIGHT SEARCH & RESCUE

Lightly Damaged: Search, triage and treat victims where you find them. Evacuate victims to the treatment areas as needed.

Moderate Damage: Search and evacuate victims, triage them in a safe environment. Leave any dead for extraction by EMS.

Heavy Damage: Stay Out!

INTERIOR SEARCH & RESCUE/ASSESSMENT



When You **ENTER** When You **EXIT**

Date and time the task force entered and exited the building.



Number of live and/or dead victims.



DO NOT enter any building that has an enclosed X taped or painted on the exterior, as it has been determined to be unsafe.

FIRE EXTINGUISHER




Always operate fire extinguisher in the upright position, and remember the acronym:

P - Pull
A - Aim
S - Squeeze
S - Sweep

Type A - Ordinary Materials
Type B - Flammable Liquids
Type C - Electrical
Type D - Combustible Metals

UTILITY SHUT-OFF



TRIAGE

Begin triage with a voice command for victims to follow you out of danger, help remove the walking wounded from the scene. Upon returning begin rapid assessment by asking...
